LGBT people face huge levels of discrimination and abuse, in all areas of their lives, simply for being themselves.

Between 0.6 - 1% of the world's population are estimated to be trans.


Around 1.5 million people (3.2%) identified with an LGB+ orientation



#### **Transphobia**

Transphobia consists of negative attitudes, feelings, or actions towards transgender people.

Transphobia can include fear, aversion, hatred, violence or anger towards people who do not conform to social gender expectations



# Experience of Hate Crimes

- Many trans and non-binary people who participated in this research recounted incidents where they had been threatened or intimidated because of their identity
- Many trans people rarely viewed incidents such as being shouted at in the street or name calling as 'hate crime', and did not report them to the police.
- Some mentioned recognising some incidents as hate crime only some months or years after the event.
- There were, however, some who had experienced incidents which were very serious and obviously hate crimes.
- Two trans women who had been the victim of intimidating behaviour both said that they had reported the incident to the police, not because they expected the perpetrator to be caught, but because they felt it was important that transphobic crimes were recorded and counted.

### Abusive relationships

- Humiliated or emotionally abused- 92%
- Been afraid of partner/ex-partner- 77%
- Put down or told you are worthless- 67%
- Tried to limit the time you spent with your friends-66%
- Forced to have sexual activity- 59%
- Persistently commented negatively on how you dress- 58%
- Persistently checked where you are- 54%
- Told who you could see and where you could go-51%
- Kicked, hit, slapped or otherwise physically hurt-45%



LGBT in Britain Work Report One in eight trans people (12 per cent) have been physically attacked by customers or colleagues in the last year because they are trans.



#### What?

#### Transphobic Hate Crime Report 2020

In the last 12 months (227 participants):

- 4 in 5 respondents had experienced a form of transphobic hate crime
- 1 in 4 had experienced transphobic physical assault or the threat of physical assault
- Nearly 1 in 5 had experienced transphobic sexual assault or the threat of sexual assault



#### Where?

Transphobic Hate Crime Report 2020 **6 in 10** respondents had experienced transphobia online

**5 in 10** had experienced transphobia in the street

3 in 10 had experienced transphobia at work

1 in 4 had experienced transphobia at home



#### Who?

#### Transphobic Hate Crime Report 2020

- More than 5 in 10 respondents had received transphobic abuse from a stranger
- Nearly 5 in 10 had received transphobic abuse from a transphobic 'activist', and 2 in 10 had been targeted by a coordinated group
- 4 in 10 had received transphobic abuse from a relative
- Nearly 4 in 10 had received transphobic abuse from someone in the LGBTQIA+ community

#### LGBT in Scotland Health Report

- More than half of trans people (52 per cent) have thought of taking their own life in the last year
- Three in ten trans people (31 per cent) have selfharmed in the last year, compared to 13 per cent of LGB people who aren't trans.
- Half of LGBT people (49 per cent) reported that they had experienced depression in the last year, including seven in ten trans people (72 per cent).
- Almost two in five trans people (37 per cent)
   have avoided healthcare treatment for fear of
   discrimination.
- Nearly three in five trans people (**59 per cent**) have experienced healthcare staff having a lack of understanding of specific trans health needs.

# Stonewall staying Safe Online

- Three in ten LGBTQ+ young people (30 per cent) have been bullied with comments, messages, videos or pictures that were mean, untrue, secret or embarrassing.
- More than one in ten (11 per cent) have received threatening messages or abuse.
- Three per cent say that sexually suggestive pictures or messages about them have been shared without their consent.
- Three per cent say that others have pretended to be them or someone else using a fake account.
- Six per cent have been filmed or photographed without their consent.
